Wisdom, Strength & Beauty

Triads or groups of 3 represent ideas or objects. Triads show up in Nature, Politics, and Religion. In the beginning for early man the cosmos was made up of the Sun, Moon, and the Stars. We call the natural every day elements The Earth, Wind, and Fire. We can see Triads in 3 leaf clovers. We live in a 3 dimensional world. As far as politics go the US Constitution is made up of 3 branches, Legislative, Executive, and Judicial. In religion many faiths teach God, your Neighbor, and Yourself. All are arranged to intrigue us to the power of Triads historically and in our practice as Freemasons.

Triads appear through out ancient systems of thought, for example, in numerology triads are seen as the combination of odd (1) and even (2) for a total of 3. Three is the symbol of perfection in many ancient cultures and mystic philosophers, with three being the sum total of God. Triads also show up in early geography and in numerous places in geometry. As all math scholars know, you can find any location on a plane by the reference of 3 points. Even anthropological artifacts reflect Triads. Grammar uses subject, verb, and object and adjectives use good, better, and best. The Bible states: Charity, Faith, and Hope. The French Revolution used Triads in their morals: Equality, Liberty, and Fraternity. Even Hegelian philosophy is based on threes: Thesis, Antithesis, and Synthesis.

We as Freemasons proudly display Triads in our Lodges and Masonic writings allowing us opportunity to search and reflect our symbolism.

Threes appear in the lecture of the winding stairs as we are shown the first three steps. They remind Freemasons of the beginning 3 degrees and the three principle officers of the Lodge, the Worshipful Master, Senior and Junior Wardens. We also display the three Greater lights and the three Lesser lights with the opening and closing rituals of the Lodge. The three Greater lights represent the Holy Bible, Square and Compass. The three Lesser light are named Wisdom, Strength and Beauty. They are said to make Masons better men along with patience, fortitude, and peace making.

The first three degrees are said to emphasize the three stages of our life as Freemasons Youth, Manhood, and finally Master Masons. They also monitor us in the beginning with the three grand principles of Brotherly love, Relief, and Truth. Our three moral guides are Fraternity, Charity, and Virtue.

The lesson for us is to understand that the use of Triads in our rituals and lectures give us reason and help us strive for perfection by becoming better Masons while practicing Wisdom, Strength and Beauty in everything we state our life to be.
